Subject April 1, 1990 Salary Increase and Other Changes in Salary for Management/Confidential Employees and Other Employees excluded from Collective Bargaining Units	Bulletin No. P-650
	Date March 9, 1990

Chapter 732 of the Laws of 1988 provides for a salary increase, new salary schedule and for an increase in Location Pay for management/confidential employees and other employees excluded from collective bargaining units.

A. Management/Confidential employees (NU 06), unrepresented employees of the Division of Military and Naval Affairs (NU 46) and employees of PERB (NU 66)

The legislation provides a new Salary Schedule which reflects a 5½% increase over the April 1989 schedule. A copy of the April 1, 1990 Salary Schedule is attached; for grades 603-617 OSC has listed additional salaries which are \$750 and \$1500 above the job rates.

Effective April 1, 1990, employees in graded (including grade 668), N.S. (grade 600) and trainee (grade 800) positions will receive a 5½% salary increase, rounded to the next whole dollar.

B. Correction Superintendents paid under Section 19 of the Correction Law (Grade 700)

The legislation provides new salary schedules effective April 1, 1990 as listed below.

1. For facilities with an inmate population of 400 or more

<u>Hiring Rate</u>	<u>Job Rate</u>
\$68,509	\$93,693

2. For facilities with an inmate population of less than 400

<u>Hiring Rate</u>	<u>Job Rate</u>
\$53,152	\$67,314

Effective April 1, 1990 all Correction Superintendents (grades 600 and 700), will receive a salary increase of 5½%, rounded to the next whole dollar.

C. Employees of the State Police whose salaries are provided for in Section 215.1(a) of the Executive Law (NU 18)

Effective April 1, 1990 all employees will receive a salary increase of 5½%, rounded to the next whole dollar.

The legislation provides for the withholding of any increase or partial increase by the Director of the Budget, for employees in any of the categories covered by the bill and described above. You will receive instructions from the Division of the Budget on this process.

Location PayNYC, Rockland, Westchester, Nassau and Suffolk Counties

The amount of location pay in these areas has been increased to \$701 annually (\$26.88 biweekly) for the fiscal year beginning April 1, 1990. Location pay is paid to all full-time employees whose principal place of employment or official station is in these areas.

Monroe County

The amount remains at \$200 (\$7.67 biweekly) for employees as previously described in Bulletin P-588, dated December 21, 1988.

Salary Increase

The salary increase and increase in location pay are effective from the first day of Payroll Period #1L, March 29-April 11, 1990 (checks dated April 25, 1990) for Administration agencies and April 5-18, 1990 (checks dated May 3, 1990) for Institutions.

The processing of the increase is similar to the description contained in Bulletin P-648. Follow the instructions in that Bulletin for review of the tentative payroll and Exception Listing and the submission of PR-75's.

If the Director of the Budget determines that a salary increase should be withheld for an employee whom OSC has automatically increased, a PR-75 must be submitted to report the approved salary. In addition, Correction Superintendents who are grade 700 will not be increased automatically; PR-75's must be submitted for the salary increase. Use transaction code COR FY SAL.
